

How to log into & use Google Classroom



Sept 2020



Google Classroom is a free web service, developed by Google for schools, that aims to simplify creating, distributing, and marking assignments in a paperless way. The primary purpose of Google Classroom is to streamline the process of sharing files between teachers and students and to allow communication to take place.

Google Classroom will work in any browser on any device, although you will have to install apps if using a tablet or phone.

How to log in to Google Classroom

The old classes have been archived and all email address passwords have been reset so to start using our new Sept 2020 Google Classroom you will need to

Log in to Google Classroom:

Enter https://classroom.google.com/ into your address bar

Then enter your account details:

Email address: <u>xxxxxxx@whatpfat.com</u> Password: xxxxxxxxx Note: use the password in the letter not your previous password.

And click Accept on the user agreement then Continue

Click the + in the top right and Enter your **Class Code** to **Join** your class.

The Stream Page

The stream is the homepage of Google Classroom. It allows teachers to post reminders, comments or questions. The Stream also shows announcements of work and the most recent information will be at the top.

Pupils are no longer allowed to post comments on the Stream as you were during Lockdown as Google Classroom is for homework not general chat. You can make comments and ask your teacher questions in your Classwork when you hand in work on an Assignment. Remember to use formal English and to always show your WHA school Values being respectful, and honest to everyone.



The Classwork Page

The first assignment set during Lockdown was a self portrait and this is the kind of thing you may be asked to do. After reading the introduction and instructions in the Self Portrait slides (step 1) and viewing the videos (2) and other information (3) you should create your self portrait (e.g. paint it on cardboard, then when finished take a photograph and add it or you could use a computer program to create your self portrait and save it then add or even use Drawings for your self portrait) then add your work to **hand in** so it can be seen and marked.
